11 SOCIAL LESSONS FROM SINDOOR

FOR BUSINESS & LIFE

1. Redefine your normal, with pride. Stop doing things "the way they've always been done."
2. Set new standards of what's okay. Set boundaries. Don't normalize the unacceptable.
3. Timely, planned responses beat reactive ones. When facing challenges - pause, plan, calculate, then act with purpose.
4. Hire for ability, not assumptions. Talent often hides where you least expect it.
5. Lift the weakest link. Your team is only as strong as its most vulnerable member.
6. United we stand, divided we fall. Disagreements are healthy, division is deadly. Find common ground even with those you oppose on specifics
7. Share information. Transparency builds trust. Share what you can, acknowledge what you can't, and explain why.
8. Don't believe everything you see. Apply healthy skepticism to information that confirms your existing beliefs, they're the easiest to accept without scrutiny.
9. Trust your instincts, but back them with proof. Either alone is insufficient.
10. Autonomy creates efficiency. Micromanagement kills creativity and slows response. Give clear objectives, then trust your team to execute.
11. Staying quiet won't make problems disappear. Name problems early. Silence gives them space to grow.
